## MORE AMMO

**John 12:29 NIV** The crowd that was there and heard it said it had thundered; others said an angel had spoken to him. **30** Jesus said, "This voice was for your benefit, not mine. **31** Now is the time for judgment on this world; now the prince of this world will be driven out. **32** And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself."

In the original Greek, "light" (phōs) means clarity, purity, and revelation.

- 1. God is radiance and holiness. God does not simply emit light; God embodies pure, clarifying holiness that leaves no shadow. This light demands truth, exposes what survives in secrecy, and summons a life shaped by clarity rather than camouflage. When God's radiance fills a life, sin loses its foothold and pretense falls away.
- 2. Walking in the light requires honesty. Claiming fellowship while practicing secrecy constitutes spiritual self-deception. True walking in the light involves transparent confession, relinquishing selective obedience, and refusing comfortable compromises that preserve reputation over righteousness. Honesty rebuilds integrity and reconnects the isolated heart to covenant community.
  - 3. Fellowship is the fruit of light. Shared obedience produces real community: compassion, accountability, and mutual restoration. The light enables believers to see one another with clarity and mercy, turning individual holiness into a communal family that forgives and strengthens. Fellowship becomes both evidence and the engine of sanctification.
- 4. Obedience builds spiritual resilience. Sustained obedience trains endurance and discernment, not merely momentary zeal. Persistent walking in the light produces spiritual stamina to rise after defeat, recognize disguised temptation, and keep the enemy underfoot. Resilience grows where practice, confession, and reliance on divine light shape daily choices.
